ACTION ITEM: LOCAL CONTROL FUNDING FORMULA (LCFF) SUPPLEMENTAL ALLOCATION FOR THE 2013-14 SCHOOL YEAR


DESCRIPTION: Chapter 47, Statutes of 2013 (AB 97, Committee on Budget) – enacted as part of the 2013-14 budget package – majorly changes both in the way the state allocates funding to school districts and the way the state supports school districts. One of the main components of Chapter 47 is the creation of the Local Control Funding Formula (LCFF). The LCFF has several components that are the targeted base rate, supplemental funding and concentration funding.

The LCFF Supplemental Funding for the Orange Unified School District has been determined to be \$800,000 based on the unduplicated count of target students – English Learners, socio-economically disadvantaged students and foster youth. This funding is proposed to be allocated to each school based on the number of qualified students. The State Board of Education has not provided a template for spending the funds for the 2013-14 school year. The regulations and template for planning will be provided to school districts for the Local Control and Accountability Plan (LCAP) for funds allocated for the 2014-15.

Although not required for 2013-14, in order to provide involvement to stakeholders in the LCFF Supplemental Funding process for 2013-14:

- Principals have provided information on the new funding model, the LCFF and LCAP, and research based educational strategies
- Information was provided in Staff Leadership Team meetings, PTA meetings, Parent Organizations, School Site Council meetings, English Learners Advisory Council meetings, public meetings, student advisory groups and community meetings
- Access has been provided to the public through the District Website and school site newsletters
- School sites have integrated the funds with the existing School Site Plans to ensure accountability of the process and existing support to the target students

LCFF Supplemental Funding will be utilized by the schools sites to support the target students in the following methods:

- Professional development for teachers aligned to the academic content standards and intensive interventions
- Technology devices for technology-based instruction for purposes of improving the academic performance and engagement of target students
- Intensive Intervention supports for the target students
- Instructional materials to support increase in text complexity for target students



TOPIC: **KCOMM - PUBLIC INFORMATION SERVICES**

DESCRIPTION: At the October 24, 2013 meeting, Mr. Ledesma authored an information item concerning retaining a public information professional or firm to provide ongoing support to staff in communicating with parents and the community on the High School Facility Master Plans (HSFMP).


During discussion, concern was expressed about the narrowness of the scope as originally proposed, HSFMP. Interest was expressed in expanding the outreach efforts to include student achievement and Common Core (21st Century Learning). Since that meeting, the State Board of Education has promulgated regulations for the Local Control and Accountability Plan (LCAP) which includes community outreach as a mandate.

KCOMM, a marketing services firm, has in-depth experience in the education market with clients including Chapman University, University of Phoenix, UCI and the Orange County Office of Education. Some of the services that they can provide include: write and distribute press releases; reporter briefings; story angle development; develop marketing materials; development materials and public relations placements; create and coordinate messaging/communications for events; and feature public relations efforts on social media sites.

FISCAL IMPACT: Not to exceed \$50,000

RECOMMENDATION: It is recommended that the Board of Education authorize staff to enter into a contract with KCOMM to provide public information services.



TOPIC: **PROPOSED REVISION TO BOARD POLICY– FIRST READING**

DESCRIPTION: The District's Board policies are reviewed and updated periodically. As new state and federal laws and regulations are enacted, affected policies must be revised or updated.

The following Board Policy is presented for a first reading:

- BP 5131.62 Tobacco

The Board of Education will receive the proposed Board Policy revision for a first reading.

StudentsTobacco

The Board of Education recognizes that tobacco use presents serious health risks and desires to provide support and assistance in the prevention and intervention of tobacco use among youth.

Students shall not smoke or use tobacco, or any product containing tobacco or nicotine, while on campus, while attending school-sponsored activities, or while under the supervision and control of District employees. (Education Code 48901) **This prohibition also applies to electronic nicotine delivery systems, such as electronic cigarettes, electronic hookahs, and other vapor emitting devise, with or without nicotine content, or any other type of device that serves as a nicotine delivery system or that mimic the use of tobacco products of any kind.**

The District's comprehensive prevention/intervention program shall be based on an ongoing assessment of objective data regarding tobacco use in the schools and community and on research identifying strategies that have proven effective in preventing or reducing tobacco use among youth. The program shall be designed to meet a set of measurable goals and objectives and shall be periodically evaluated to assess progress.

The District shall provide developmentally appropriate tobacco use prevention instruction for students in grades kindergarten through 12. The Superintendent or designee also may provide students with counseling and other support services to assist in the prevention or reduction of tobacco use.

Because of the additional health risks of tobacco use for prenatal development, the District shall provide outreach, motivational and other support services to prevent or reduce tobacco use among pregnant and parenting minors.

Information about smoking cessation programs shall be made available and encouraged for students and staff. (Health and Safety Code 104420)

The Superintendent or designee shall coordinate prevention and cessation efforts with the local health department, other local agencies and community organizations and shall involve students, parents/guardians, families and the community in support of school-based programs.



TOPIC: **PURCHASE ORDERS LIST**

DESCRIPTION: Purchase orders and change orders have been processed in accordance with the rules and regulations of the Board of Education and applicable legal requirements of the State of California.


District procedures and computer system controls require that an approved purchase order, pay voucher, current liability, or credit memo exist on the District's computer system prior to the issuance of warrants. There may be multiple warrants drawn against a given purchase order, up to the maximum amount for that purchase order. Transportation will be provided by rental van and the driver will have an approved OUSD Driver Certification on file prior to this trip. The chaperones and students will stay at the Embassy Suites. The cost per student is \$300 and no student is prevented from making the field trip due to lack of sufficient funds per Education Code 35330(b), 35331. The students will not miss any school days. A substitute is not required.

FISCAL IMPACT:

These items will have no fiscal impact to the District.

TOPIC: **BOOSTER CLUBS**


DESCRIPTION Booster Clubs are separate organizations from a school district to contribute financial and moral support. California Education Code section 51521 requires that all organizations that conduct fundraising to benefit clubs, schools, students or the district have prior approval from the district's governing board. The Orange Unified School District has adopted Board Policy 1230 and administrative regulations to establish specific conditions and controls for the relationship between organizations and the District. The following school and Booster Clubs have completed the required application and provided: A list of site officers, tax identification numbers, non-profit 501(c)(3), bylaws, proposed budget and proposed activities. These documents have been reviewed by the site principal for submission for Board approval. Booster Clubs may be revoked by the principal and shall be reauthorized by the Board of Education every five years.







Pupils, including English Learners, who have not passed one or both parts of the high school exit examination by the end of the 12th grade are entitled to receive intensive instruction and services for up to two consecutive academic years after completion of the 12th grade, or until the pupil has passed both parts of the examination, whichever comes first


DESCRIPTION: This contract was board approved through June 2014 on May 10, 2012. Educational Services has received notification from the Children and Families Commission of Orange County that the District will receive additional funds to support early learning services to children through age five. Amended funding amounts for the 2013-14 Fiscal Year are \$22,000 for the First 5 California Child Signature Program (CSP). The term of this agreement remains from July 1, 2012 through June 30, 2014.

The Commission has invested in school readiness since 2000 to provide early care and education opportunities to meet critically important early childhood development needs and maximize potential and success in school. Since 2004, the Commission has invested in the School Nurse Initiative to provide direct nursing care to ensure healthy and safe school environments and promote community involvement in children's health services.

FISCAL IMPACT: Receipt of funding of \$1,461,544

RECOMMENDATION: It is recommended that the Board of Education accept this funding and authorize the Superintendent or designee to enter into an appropriate agreement.


