- Is always a team player.



DESCRIPTION: Orange High School has been named as a beneficiary of the Maxine Huber Trust. The Trust has provided an initial distribution of \$265,000 to the school. Additional funds will be allocated at a later date upon finalization of the Trust. Orange High requests the accrued interest income be granted to Orange High. For the remainder of the 2013-14 school year, the funds will be utilized to support Orange High School as follows:

- A memorial to Maxine Huber will be placed in the alumni corner at Shaffer and Walnut streets. The alumni corner will be a new addition to Orange High as delineated in the Facilities Master Plan.
- Ongoing support of the PRIDE (Preparedness, Respect, Integrity, Determination, Excellence) Positive Behavior and Interventions Support (PBIS) program. Recognition of students and staff who exemplify behavioral expectations.
- Orange High School "Maxine Huber Mini Grants" will be offered through an on-going proposal process. The mini-grants will be used to support teacher/student programs and will not exceed \$50,000. Grants will be awarded by a joint panel of the management team and the instructional leadership team.


FISCAL IMPACT: Receipt of funds to Orange High School from the Maxine Huber trust totaling \$265,000, with estimated expenditures of \$70,000 for the 2013-14 school year.

RECOMMENDATION: It is recommended that the Board of Education authorize the Superintendent or designee to accept the initial distribution of \$265,000 from the Maxine Huber Trust to Orange High School and grant the accrued interest income to Orange High School.

Item No. 12.B.

- TOPIC:** **FINAL ACCEPTANCE OF THE HIGHEST BID FOR THE SALE OF KILLEFER SITE AND DELEGATION OF AUTHORITY TO EXECUTE FINAL PURCHASE AND SALE AGREEMENT**
- DESCRIPTION:** On August 25, 2011, the Board of Education adopted Resolution 03-11-12, declaring the approximate 1.70 acre former Killefer Elementary School site (the "Property"), located at 541 North Lemon Street in the City and County of Orange, California as surplus.
- At the February 13, 2014 meeting, the Board of Education approved Resolution No. 13-13-14 authorizing staff to offer the property for sale at no less than the minimum bid of two million four hundred thousand dollars (\$2,400,000). In the event that no conforming bid proposals are received, the Board of Education may consider counteroffers.
- As the final step in the sale of the Property, the District conducted a public auction for the sale of the Property pursuant to Education Code Section 17472. The public auction was held on April 16, 2014 at the District Office where the sealed bid proposals were opened, examined and declared.
- At this Board meeting, final acceptance of the highest bid will be made. The Board may select the highest of any bids or may reject all bids.
- FISCAL IMPACT:** Unknown
- RECOMMENDATION:** It is recommended that the Board of Education 1) approve and accept the highest bid for the purchase of the Property as well as the bid ranking for the purchase of the Property as presented; and 2) approve a delegation of authority to the Superintendent or his designee to execute the final Purchase and Sale Agreement.



The District's initial reopener proposal is contingent upon projected funding by the State of California for the District's 2014-15 Budget. The District reserves the right to revise this proposal and/or to make new and different proposals at any time during the bargaining process, including but not limited to responses to proposals made by OUEA.

The District's initial proposal for 2014-15 reopener negotiations is as follows:

Article 2 – Compensation:

This Article is to be reviewed, discussed and negotiated. The District has an interest that salaries and benefits are competitive with other comparable unified school districts in Orange County consistent with the District's financial resources. The District is eliminating all furlough days, thus returning the student calendar and certificated work calendars to the pre-economic downturn levels.

Article 6 – Hours:

This Article is to be reviewed, discussed and negotiated. The District has an interest in providing flexibility for all schools to efficiently accommodate weekly staff development for certificated staff.

Article 15 – Miscellaneous Provisions:





The District reserves the right to revise this proposal and/or to make new and different proposals at any time during the bargaining process, including but not limited to responses to proposals made by CSEA.

The District's initial proposal for 2014-15 reopener negotiations is as follows:

Article 12 – Compensation:

This Article is to be reviewed, discussed and negotiated. The District has an interest that salaries and benefits are competitive with other comparable unified school districts in Orange County consistent with the District's financial resources. The District is interested in adjusting the eligibility for health and welfare benefits to 6 hours consistent with the Federal Affordable Care Act. The District is eliminating all furlough days, thus returning the classified work calendars to the pre-economic downturn levels.



TOPIC: **RE-ESTABLISHMENT OF THE POSITION OF DEPUTY SUPERINTENDENT AND APPROVAL OF CONTRACTS FOR EMPLOYMENT OF: 1) ASSISTANT SUPERINTENDENT, BUSINESS SERVICES; 2) ASSISTANT SUPERINTENDENT, HUMAN RESOURCES; AND 3) DEPUTY SUPERINTENDENT**

DESCRIPTION: Changes in state legislation have mandated a wholesale change in the management of school districts. Curriculum instruction is shifting to the Common Core State Standards (CCSS) with mandatory on-line assessments developed by the Smarter Balanced Assessment Consortium (SBAC). The funding model also changed with the implementation of the Local Control Funding Formula (LCFF) and development of Local Control and Accountability Plans (LCAP).

These changes required that the Educational Services Division responsibilities include the coordination and integration of the Educational Technology and Information Technology Departments into one department. The development and writing of the LCAP, in compliance with the LCFF, shifted budget development from a primarily Business Services Division function to a combined responsibility with Educational Services and Human Resources, with public outreach and development of the LCAP being headed by Educational Services.

These increases in responsibility and interaction with the Business Services and Human Resources Division managers require that the organizational structure of the District be modified to include a Deputy Superintendent. The current Assistant Superintendent of Educational Services has taken the lead in addressing these challenges as they have developed and is performing duties that are commensurate with the level of Deputy Superintendent.

Additionally, the contracts for the Assistant Superintendent, Business Services and Assistant Superintendent, Human resources are expiring as of June 30, 2014 and should be extended at this time.

All contracts include language conforming to AB 1344, requiring that if the contract is terminated, any cash settlement related to the termination that the employee may receive from the District shall be fully reimbursed to the District if the employee is convicted of a crime involving an abuse of his or her office or position. Additionally, the contracts provide for reimbursement of necessary mileage at the then current IRS approved rate in lieu of any automobile allowance; health insurance at the same rates and District contribution levels as leadership employees; earned doctoral stipend as provided for other employees; placement on the leadership salary schedule with the same salary adjustments as may be applied to other leadership employees, including any furlough days; and longevity credit for all applicable prior employment. The contracts will be in effect through June 30, 2017.



DESCRIPTION: At the March 14 and June 6, 2013 meetings, the Board of Education received information with respect to General Obligation (GO) Bonds and the impact of proposed legislation on long-term facilities financing to the District. Additionally, at the October 24, 2013 meeting, the Board of Education received information on the steps necessary to ensure a successful bond measure from TBWB Strategies.

This evening, the Board of Education will receive information from John Aust, Ph.D., owner of CP Appraisers and Expert Witness, regarding the relationship of a school bond election and its effect on home values. Dr. Aust has provided expert testimony in court over 100 times. His area of expertise is in real estate appraisals. CP Appraisers services include mortgage, legal issues, transactional legal issues, diminution in value, construction defect cases, and more. The company specializes in market value appraisals.

TOPIC: **GENERAL OBLIGATION BOND OVERVIEW – LEGAL ISSUES REGARDING ISSUANCE OF GENERAL OBLIGATIONS BONDS UNDER PROPOSITON 39**

DESCRIPTION: At the March 14 and June 6, 2013 meetings, the Board of Education received information with respect to General Obligation (GO) bonds and the impact of proposed legislation on long-term facilities financing to the District. Additionally, at the October 24, 2013 meeting, the Board of Education received information on the steps necessary to ensure a successful bond measure from TBWB Strategies.

This evening, the Board of Education will receive information from Mr. David Casnocha, Senior Shareholder from Stradling Yocca Carlson & Rauth (SYCR), regarding the legal issues relating to the issuance of GO bonds. Mr. Casnocha is the firm's primary education finance bond counsel and has been a bond counsel for 37 years. In the last ten years, Mr. Casnocha has been bond counsel on over 800 school and community college district GO bond issues.

The following topics will be discussed:

- Rules and conditions regarding Proposition 39
- Purposes, duties, and authorized activities of the Citizens' Bond Oversight Committee
- Voter survey, campaign organization, appropriate use of public moneys for these activities, as well as information on the "do's" and "don'ts" of campaign activities of the District

TOPIC: **LOCAL CONTROL AND ACCOUNTABILITY PLAN UPDATE**

DESCRIPTION: The State of California has adopted a new model for funding school districts called the Local Control Funding Formula (LCFF). The LCFF allocates resources to districts based on three measures: 1) the **Base Grant** which is based on attendance for all students, similar to the revenue limit model; 2) the **Supplemental Grant** which is based on the unduplicated number of students who qualify based on designations of English learner, low socio-economic status, or foster youth; and 3) the **Concentration Grant** which is based on district populations in excess of 55% of the unduplicated students who are eligible for the supplemental grant.

A requirement of the LCFF is development and adoption of a Local Control and Accountability Plan (LCAP) by local boards of education. While the State, through the State Board of Education, has not yet finalized the regulations and accountability rubrics, there are eight areas of State priority that must be addressed in the district's LCAP:

Conditions for Learning

- **Basic Services:** provide all students' access to fully credentialed teachers, instructional materials that align with state standards, and safe facilities.
- **Implementation of Common Core State Standards:** implement the Common Core State Standards in English and English Language Development, Mathematics and the Next Generation Science Standards.
- **Course Access:** ensure all students have access to a broad course of study to prepare them for college and careers.

Pupil Outcomes

- **Student Achievement:** improved student learning for all students and subgroups measured by local assessments, state assessments, English proficiency rates, and college and career readiness indicators.
- **Other Student Outcomes:** measuring other important student outcomes such as Career Technical Education (CTE) pathway completion, A-G Course completion, and locally identified success measures.

Engagement

- **Parental Involvement:** meaningful participation by parents that include decision making and program development
- **Student Engagement:** supporting student's connectedness and engagement in school including improved attendance and graduation rates.
- **School Climate:** provide a welcoming, healthy school culture for all students as measured by healthy kids' surveys and district discipline data.

The development and adoption of the LCAP will become the new State-mandated strategic planning process for Districts across the State of California. Actions and services identified in the eight state priorities are directly aligned to LCFF funding.

At prior Board meetings this year, the Board received information items on the LCAP Development Process and the LCFF Spending Plan for the 2013-14 school year. This evening, the Board of Education will receive an LCAP update and the District's summary of stakeholder engagement. The LCAP update is currently being shared with stakeholder committees and will be modified based on input and feedback received. The Board of Education Public Hearing on the LCAP is scheduled for May 8.

TOPIC: **REPORT ON THE STATUS OF THE SUPERINTENDENT'S EMPLOYMENT CONTRACT**

DESCRIPTION: The Agreement for Employment of Superintendent ("Agreement") between the Board of Education and Mr. Michael L. Christensen was entered into May 12, 2011 for a three-year term commencing August 2, 2011 and concluding on August 1, 2014.

The Agreement provides that in the event the Board of Education does not notify the Superintendent in writing not later than six months prior to the end of the term that the Agreement will not be either renewed or extended, then the Agreement shall be automatically extended for a term of three more years under the same terms and conditions and with the same compensation in effect as of August 1, 2014. The Superintendent is required to, and did, notify in writing all members of the Board of Education of this provision of the Agreement as of November 2013.

As a result, the Superintendent's Agreement is extended for a term of three years from August 2, 2014 to August 1, 2017 under the same terms and conditions and with the same compensation in effect as of August 1, 2014.

The Board of Education and the Superintendent retain the right to agree to amend the Superintendent's employment agreement.

The Board President requested this agenda item be placed on the public agenda as an information item. No Board action is required at this time. This item has been approved by legal counsel for the District.

TOPIC: **AGREEMENT FOR STUDENT TRANSFERS TO THE COMMUNITY SCHOOL PROGRAM AND SPECIAL SCHOOLS AND SERVICES PROGRAM BETWEEN THE ORANGE COUNTY DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION AND THE DISTRICT**

DESCRIPTION: The California Department of Education (CDE) has historically provided a mechanism to automatically transfer ADA revenue generated by county transfer students from the district of residence to the county office through the Revenue Limit and Principal Apportionment process. This automatic transfer was eliminated with the implementation of the Local Control Funding Formula (LCFF).

While the CDE has indicated that it intends to implement an automatic transfer for ADA associated with these students in the future, it is anticipated that a solution will not be available until the 2014-15 First Principal Apportionment at the earliest. In order to continue providing services to students in the interim, county offices must find an alternative approach to obtain the funding generated by the students transferred to county programs. The following are the Orange County Department of Education (OCDE) programs receiving transfer students:


- Special Education
- Community Schools
- Homeless Education

The OCDE in collaboration with a subcommittee of chief business officials developed a funding mechanism where revenues received by the districts on behalf of the county will be transferred to the county twice a year until such time as the CDE creates a mechanism to transfer county ADA funding automatically.

FISCAL IMPACT: No fiscal Impact

RECOMMENDATION: It is recommended that the Board of Education authorize the Superintendent or designee to enter into an agreement with OCDE to refer District students to Community School and Special Schools and Services program and transfer funds for these students received by the District to the county twice a year.


TOPIC: **AMENDMENT TO SANTIAGO CANYON COLLEGE SERVICE AGREEMENT** *(Originally Board Approved January 23, 2014)*

DESCRIPTION: Santiago Canyon College Continuing Education Department will provide free English as a Second Language (ESL) classes for Orange Unified School District (OUSD) parents at additional District sites. Taft Elementary and Yorba Middle Schools were original school sites offering parent ESL classes February through May 2014. Parent ESL classes will be expanded by adding sessions at Handy Elementary and Sycamore Elementary April 22 through May 22, 2014. Additionally, Taft Elementary parent ESL classes will be extended from three days to five days per week in order to incorporate English literacy skills. TOPIC: COURSE APPROVALS ~ ROP/CTE: SPECIALTY FOODS, PRINCIPLES OF BAKING I, TECH SQUAD

DESCRIPTION: The new course outlines described below have been reviewed by the Central County Regional Occupational Program/CTEp and the District's Curriculum Department.

SPECIALTY FOODS

Specialty Foods is an elective course in the Culinary Arts Pathway. This course introduces students to the contributions that various ethnic groups have made to American and International cookery. The culinary student will become familiar with the geography, food history, customs, common ingredients and preparation techniques of regions in the United States as well as countries all over the world. Theory and hands-on applications are addressed through student projects and portfolios that incorporate culinary math and business principles, as well as sanitation and safe food handling.

PRINCIPLES OF BAKING I


Principles of Baking I is an elective course in the Culinary Arts Pathway. This course introduces students to introductory baking skills, techniques, and baking principles. In the culinary industry, baking is so vast that it is usually practiced as a specialization. Students will be exposed to how baking encompasses vastly different equipment, ingredients, and kitchen design. Theory and hands-on applications are addressed through student projects and portfolios that incorporate collaboration, communication, and critical thinking.

TECH SQUAD

Students will develop expertise in help desk operations and technology troubleshooting. Through participation in the nationally recognized program, Mouse Squad, and successful completion of this course, students will be granted Mouse Squad Certification. The Mouse Squad program exposes students with opportunities to develop 21st century skills and apply them as they solve technical issues faced by their school sites. This program, modeled on industry-standard help desks in business and industry, prepares and supports participants in the cultivation of technical and leadership skills needed for success in all work environments.

FISCAL IMPACT: There is no fiscal impact for course approvals. The cost of instructional materials will be addressed during the forthcoming textbook adoption process.

TOPIC: **COURSE APPROVALS: MATHEMATICS IB HL, AP PHYSICS I, ADVANCED ALGEBRA WITH FINANCIAL APPLICATIONS and FARS I**

DESCRIPTION: The new course outlines described below have been reviewed by the Department of Curriculum and Instruction, site instructional leadership teams, and site administrators.

MATHEMATICS IB HL

As one of the four possible mathematics courses that students can take in the International Baccalaureate (IB) Diploma Program, Mathematics IB HL is a high level course that would follow AP Calculus. It enables students to develop mathematical knowledge, critical thinking, and employ and refine their powers of abstraction and generalization. Students are also encouraged to appreciate the international dimensions of mathematics and the multiplicity of its cultural and historical perspectives. Some of the topics addressed include:

- Mathematics as the science of patterns
- Exploring/modeling randomness
- Mathematics as a language
- The power of calculus

AP PHYSICS I

AP Physics I is an algebra-based physics course that is equivalent to a first year college level course. This course focuses on the understanding of algebraic concepts and skills and their application to solving complex problems. Theory and hands-on applications are addressed through two student projects that imbed learned core concepts to real world situations. Some of the topics addressed include:

- Kinematics
- Newton's Laws of Motion
- Gravitation and Circular Motion
- Work, Energy, Power and Linear Momentum
- Torque and Rotational Motion
- Simple Harmonic Motion, Waves and Sound
- Electrostatics and Simple Electric Circuits

ADVANCED ALGEBRA WITH FINANCIAL APPLICATIONS

Advanced Algebra with Financial Applications is a mathematical modeling course that is algebra-based, applications-oriented, and technology-dependent. The course addresses college preparatory mathematics topics from

Advanced Algebra, Statistics, Probability, Pre-calculus, and Calculus under seven financial umbrellas:

- Banking
- Investing
- Employment and Income Taxes
- Automobile Ownership
- Independent Living
- Retirement Planning
- Household Budgeting

This course will allow students to experience the interrelatedness of mathematical topics, find patterns, make conjectures, and extrapolate knowledge learned to new situations and problems. Students will be encouraged to utilize a myriad of problem-solving skills and strategies in real-world contexts, and to question outcomes using mathematical analysis and data to support their findings.

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FARSI I

Farsi I is an introductory course where students learn to speak, write and read at a beginning level. This course will allow students with the opportunity to read authentic text to pick up patterns in formulaic language. This includes reading for a purpose and reading different material(s) such as short stories, dialogues, and poems. The program will also enable students to produce written text, which includes using diagrams, outlines, and story maps to identify a writing plan. To achieve competence in reading and writing, mastery in oral language must be developed as a foundational piece. Due to the fact that listening and speaking are inseparable in real life settings, students will be developing these skills simultaneously in the classroom alongside the reading and writing. This course allows for numerous projects and activities that enable students to use the target language in applicable, real-life situations.

FISCAL IMPACT:

There is no fiscal impact for course approvals. The cost of instructional materials will be addressed during the forthcoming textbook adoption process.

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that the Board of Education authorize the Superintendent or designee to approve the courses presented.

TOPIC: **AMERICAN INDIAN EDUCATION GRANT APPLICATION**

DESCRIPTION: Staff requests authorization to submit the annual Title VII Native American Education Program application for federal funds under the American Indian Education, Parts I and II, Subpart 1 of the Title VII Elementary and Secondary Education Act, for a multi-year grant beginning with the 2014-15 school year and ending with the 2017-18 school year.

The funds will be used to provide services in the following areas:


1. Monitoring the academic progress and attendance of American Indian students

*iReadU***


DESCRIPTION: The Orange County Department of Education/OC Innovate Educational Technology has awarded the District the following grant:

An individual OC Innovate teacher grant in the amount of \$5,000.00 was awarded to Ilene Zedek at Prospect Elementary School. The grant titled “iReadU” will provide Ms. Zedek’s first through fifth grade students with mobile device technology to integrate technology as a component of RtI² while teaching information literacy using digital tools for research and collaboration. In order to create a high level of engagement, students will use the app *Educreations* on the iPad to record their voice and capture annotations from a text passage, then publish their work on Edmodo and Google Drive. Through this project the teacher will use instructional strategies that will engage and empower students in the “Habits of Mind” enhancing best practices while they communicate and collaborate using the iPads. Grant funding will provide eight iPads, Mobil Management Software, iPad cases and keyboards.


DESCRIPTION: The Orange County Department of Education/OC Innovate Educational Technology has awarded the District the following grant:

An individual OC Innovate teacher grant in the amount of \$5,000.00 was awarded to Abril Ceja de Anda, at Prospect Elementary School. The grant titled "Stay Calm, I'm an Expert" will provide approximately 30 third grade students with mobile device technology to retrieve, synthesize and evaluate informational text in collaboration with others. During this project students will use iPads while working in groups of three to four to conduct research on the Internet, read informative text and create annotations. They will then share their research by creating a presentation using the app iMovie, Educreations or Keynote. Presentations will be shared with classmates and parents. 
DESCRIPTION: The Orange County Department of Education/OC Innovate Educational Technology has awarded the District the following grant:

An individual OC Innovate teacher grant in the amount of \$4,963.70 was awarded to Erin Rosselli at Panorama Elementary School. The grant titled “Kinders Create” will help approximately 30 kindergarten students to access and read informative text, gather information online, and collaboratively create eBooks as a demonstration of their learning. The project includes having the students use iPad Minis to read and listen to informative text at their level using the app *Storia*. Using the text and classroom instruction focused on close reading, students will select an area of interest. Then working in groups they will research and gather information. The information will be presented using the app *Book Creator* on the iPad. The book will be shared with the whole class.

This project integrates 21st Century technology and learning through the process of collaborative inquiry and the completion of a project. This project allows for student choice, providing differentiated instruction while keeping the students motivated and engaged. Grant funding will provide 10 iPad Minis with cases and keyboards, an Apple TV, styluses, headphones, and a \$100 voucher for Apple apps.

TOPIC: **TEXTBOOK ADOPTIONS – 30-DAY REVIEW BY PUBLIC**



TOPIC: **THIRD QUARTER REPORT OF UNIFORM COMPLAINTS FOR THE WILLIAMS AND VALENZUELA CASE SETTLEMENTS**

Pupils, including English Learners, who have not passed one or both parts of the high school exit examination by the end of the 12th grade are entitled to receive intensive instruction and services for up to two consecutive academic years after completion of the 12th grade, or until the pupil has passed both parts of the examination, whichever comes first

No Uniform Complaints for any area have been reported during the third quarter for the Williams and Valenzuela Case Settlements.
