Integrated Academic Instruction

To maximize the learning and application of skills that will allow students to succeed in life, the Board believes that the integrated instruction of academic subjects should be fostered. The Board is confident that achievement will improve when students are routinely called upon to apply their classroom learning to real life and workplace situations.

The Board recognizes that integrated academic instruction will require new forms of community involvement and a new level of collaboration among schools and staff members. Career awareness, exploration and guidance should be an integral part of this curriculum.

When appropriate for assistance in planning, curriculum development and staff training, the district may call upon parents/guardians, staff, and representatives of business, profit/non-profit organizations, churches and charitable organizations, entrepreneurs, labor organizations, community agencies, employment training programs and/or institutions of higher education.
