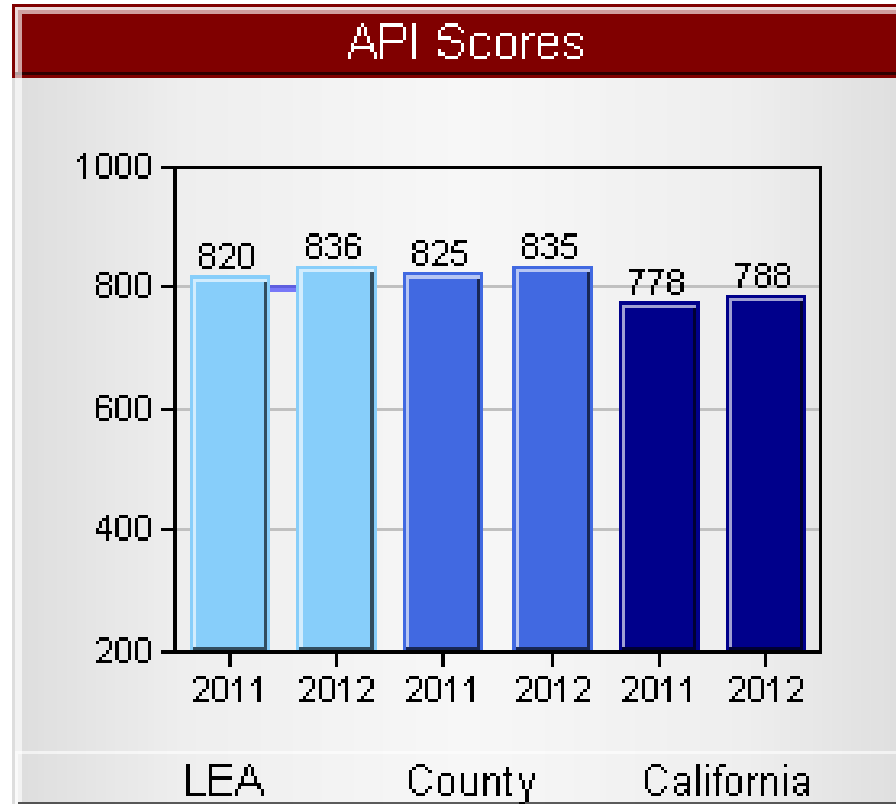

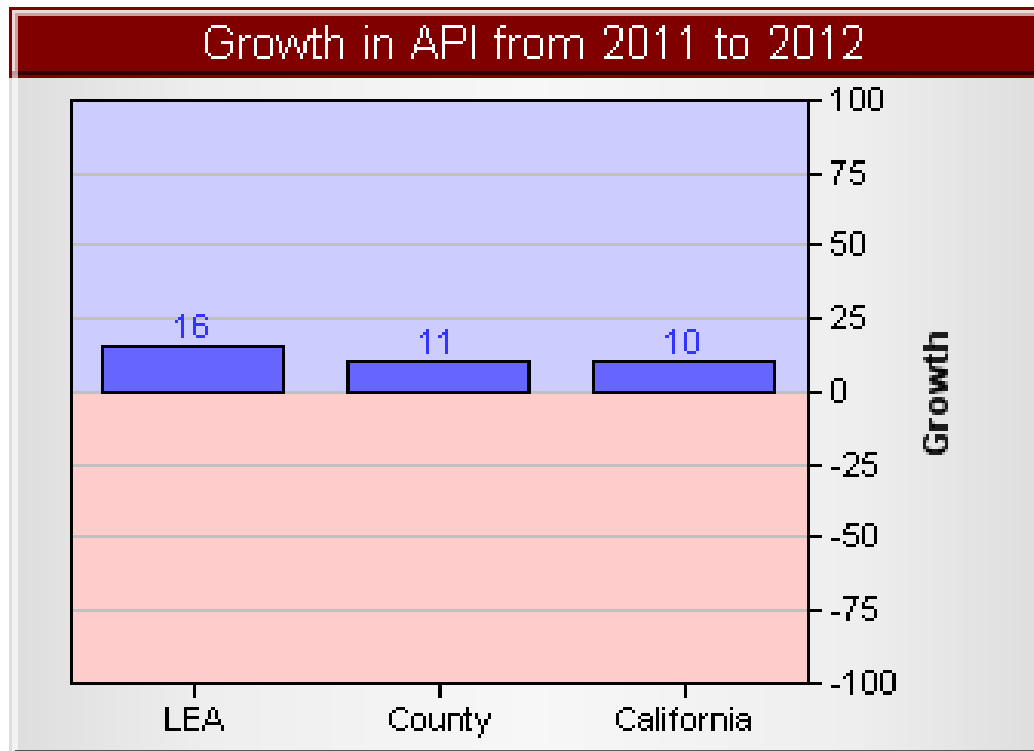

District Results – API (District/County/State)



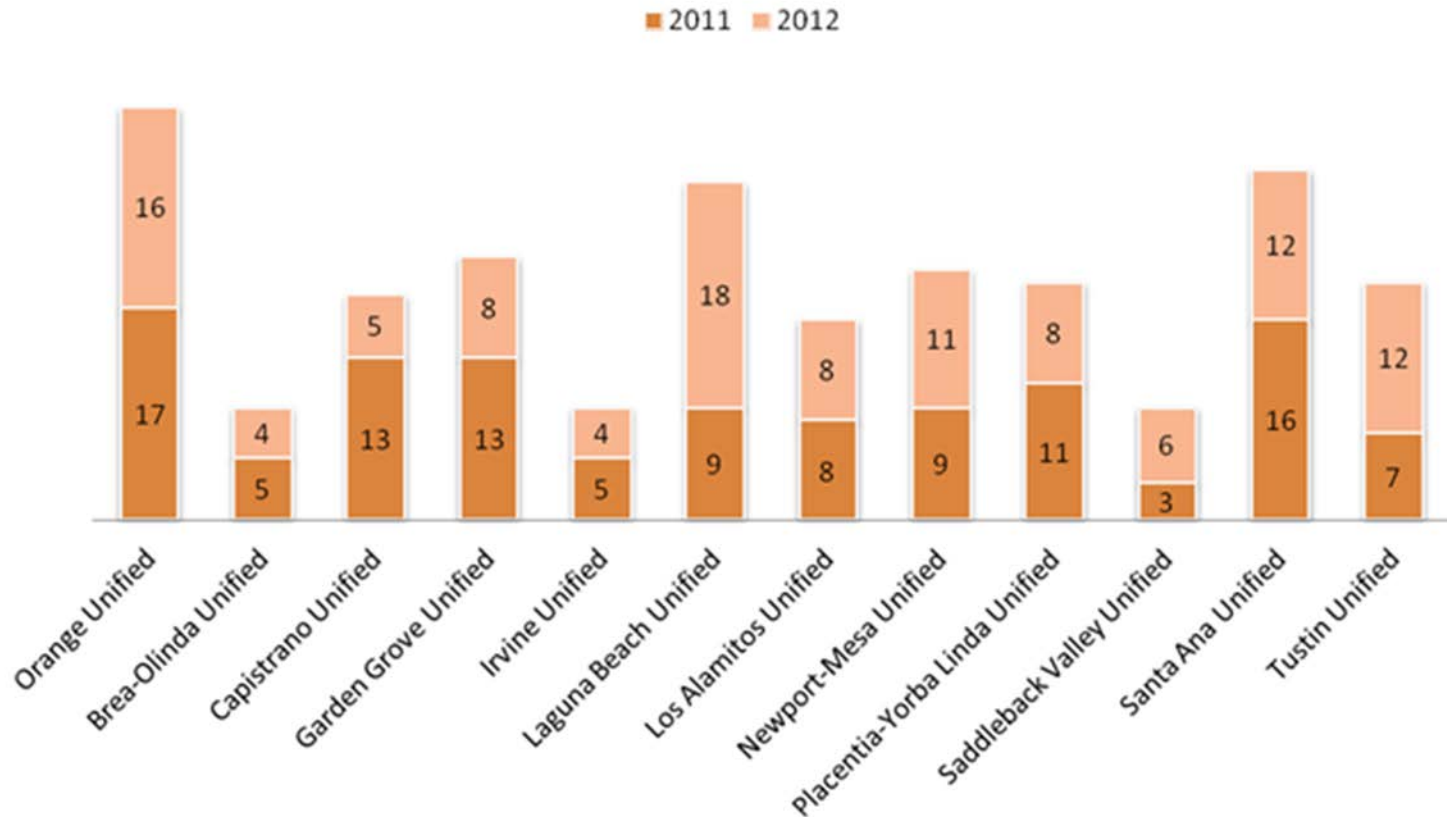

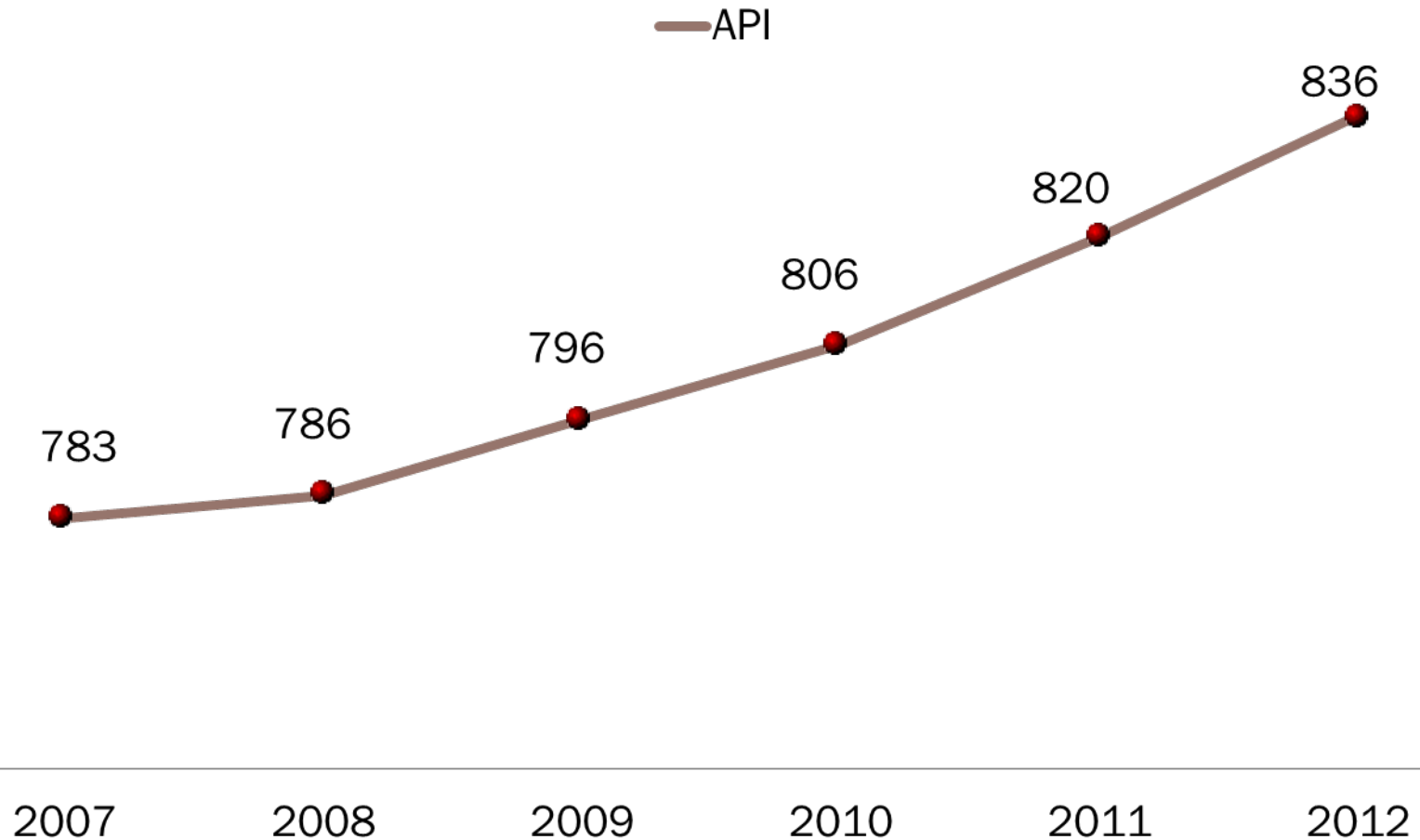


Orange County API District Growth Results

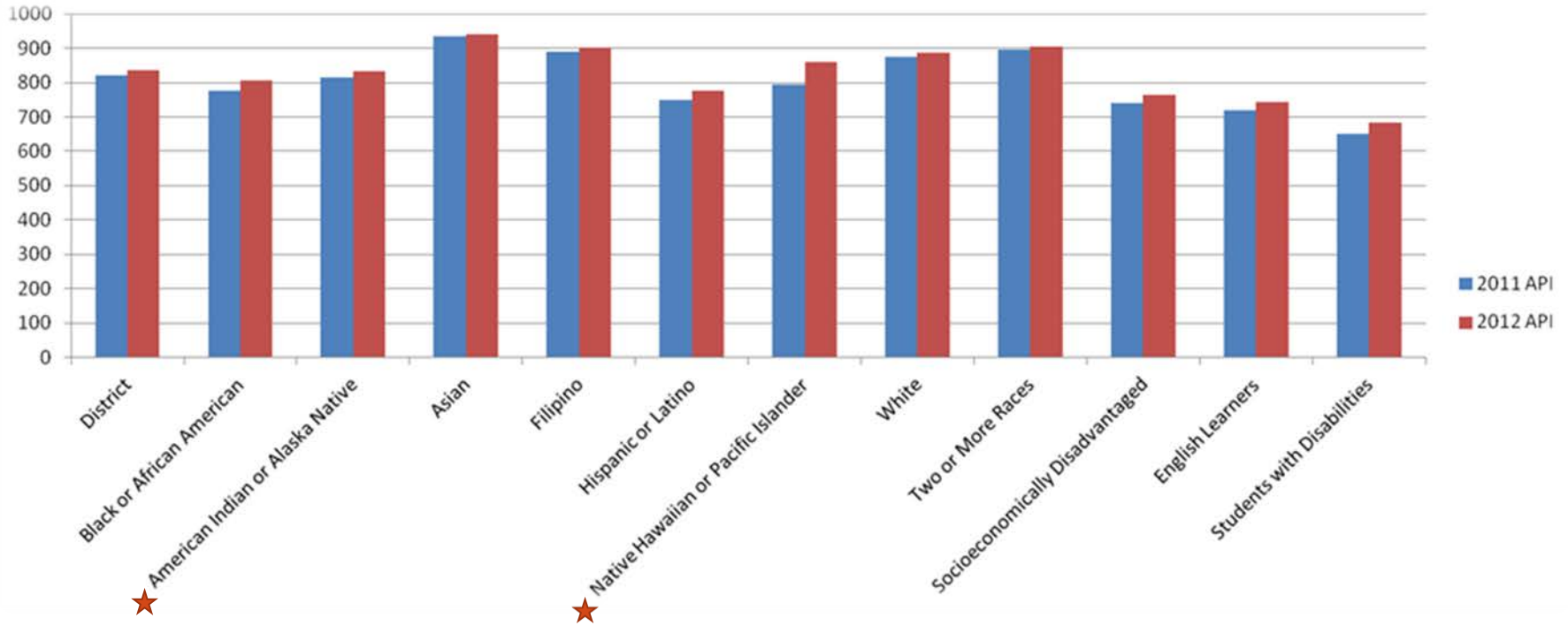

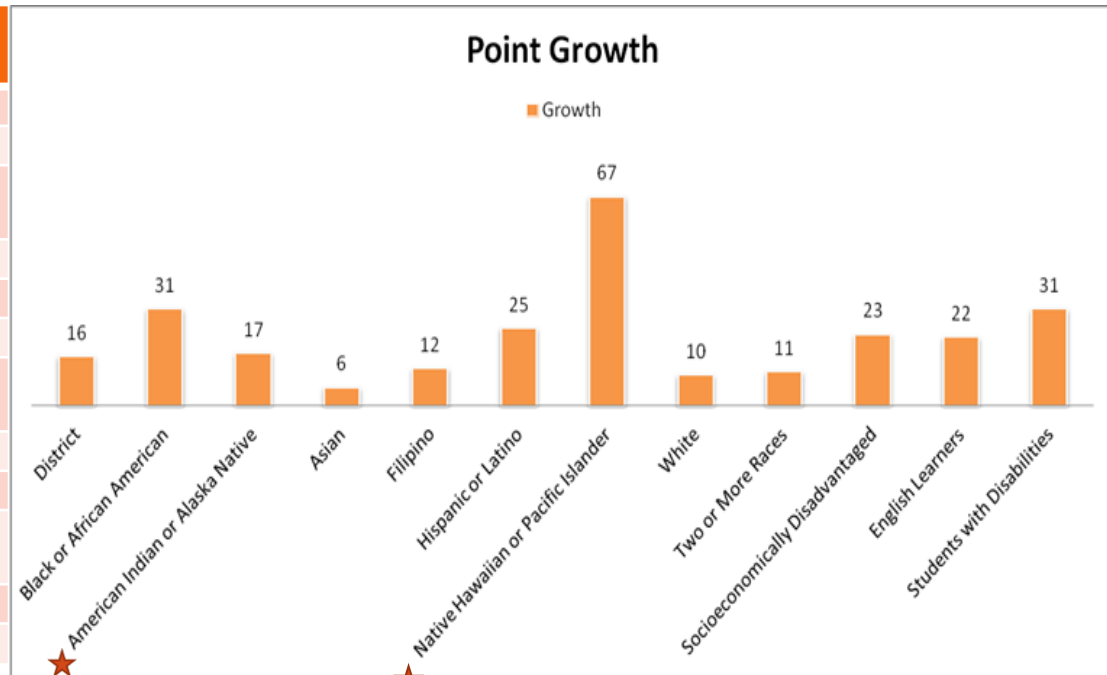

API Summary Results

- ∞ The District-wide 2012 API score of 836 demonstrates a gain of +16 points from 2011. The two year API gain is the highest for a K-12 Unified School District in Orange County.
- ∞ 11 schools in OUSD maintained an API score in 900s in 2012.
- ∞ 15 schools in OUSD maintained an API score in 800s in 2012.
- ∞ OUSD Program Improvement schools demonstrated gains in 2012 with several schools surpassing the 800 State target - Esplanade (831), Handy (811), Prospect (809), and Sycamore (805).
- ∞ All secondary schools posted a positive API gain.

API Summary Results (Continued)

- High Performing schools excel-Anaheim Hills +7 (905), Canyon Rim +33 (913), Crescent +16 (925), McPherson +9 (918), Nohl Canyon +9 (953), Panorama +1 (935), Villa Park Elementary +68 (980), and El Rancho +19 (940).
- Among elementary schools, **Villa Park ES** showed the highest 1-yr API score gain (+68). Villa Park Elementary School API is 980.
- Among middle schools, **Portola MS** showed the highest 1-yr API score gain (+29).
- Among high schools, **Orange HS** showed the highest 1-yr API score gain (+33).

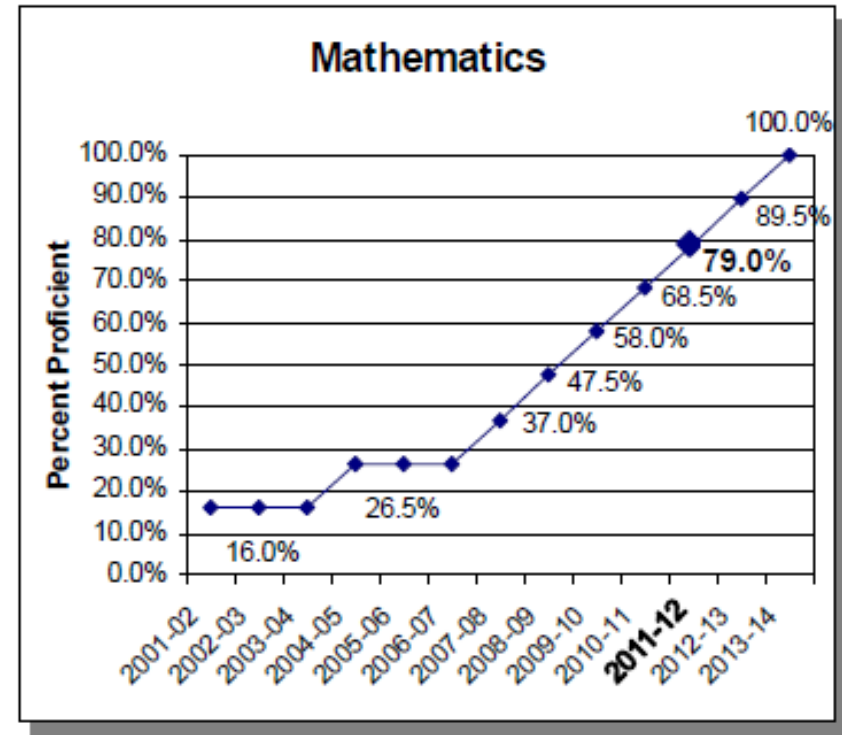
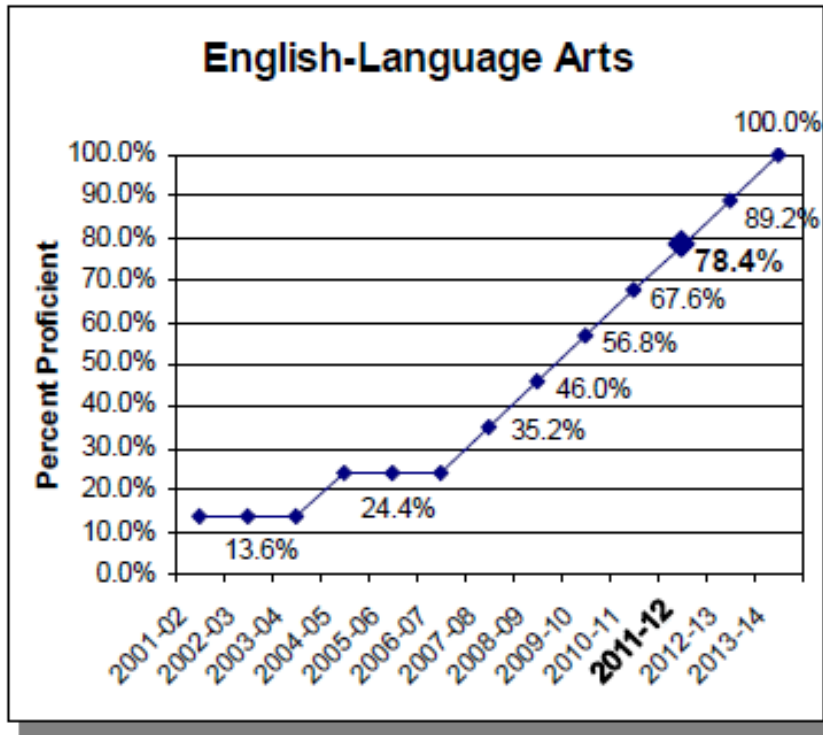
All schools are expected to meet AYP by having students meet or exceed standards in reading, math, and science.

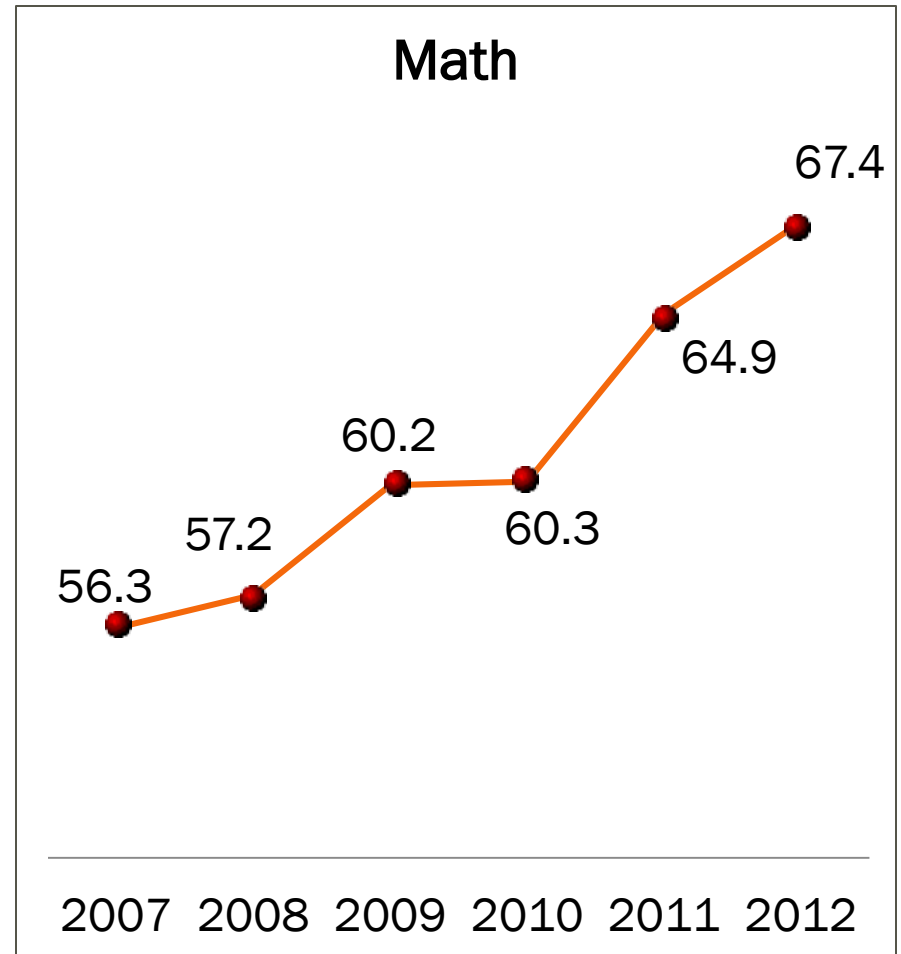
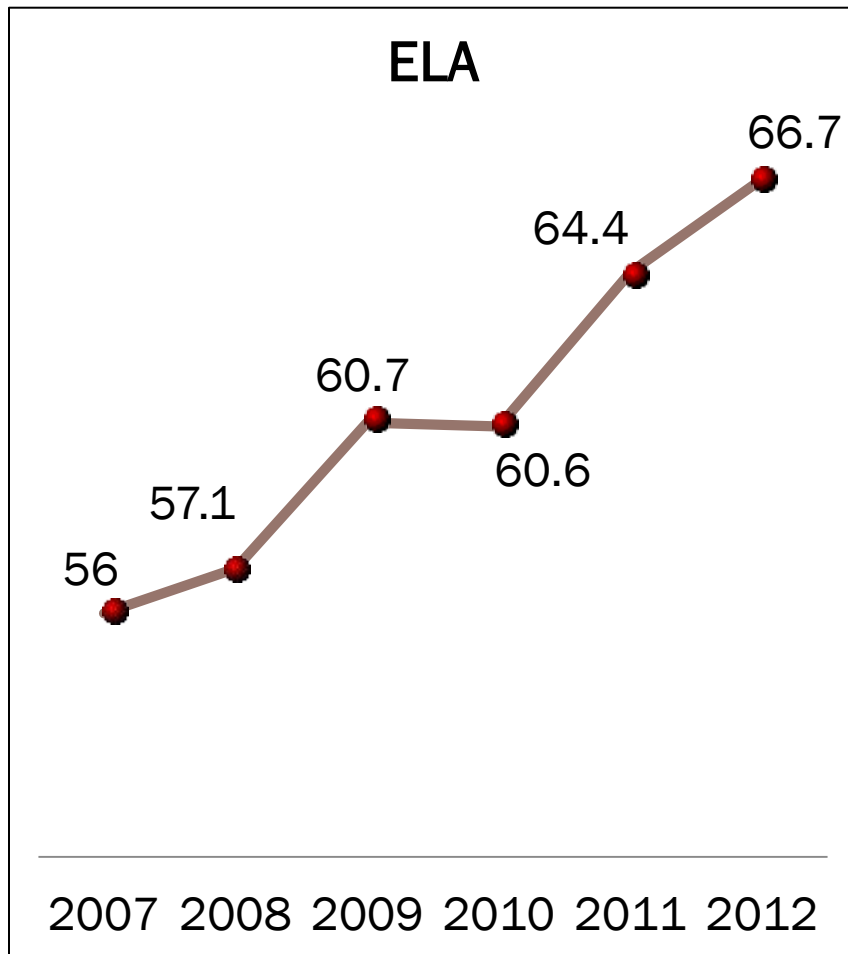

2011 School Program Improvement (PI) Status

- ☞ **5 Title I schools: Esplanade, Fairhaven, Prospect, Sycamore and Taft Elementary Schools** met all components of the AYP Criteria for the 2011-12 school year.
- ☞ **3 Schools** exited PI for making AYP 2 years in a row – **Prospect, Sycamore and Taft.**
- ☞ **1 school: Fairhaven ES** met all targets for the 6th year in row. Now a National Blue Ribbon School!

Academic Improvement Strategies

All Students Achieving

- ☞ **Safe Harbor** - A sub-group can make AYP by reducing the percentage of non-proficient students by 10% from 2011 to 2012 (NCLB's safe harbor provision).
- ☞ **Watch Groups** – specific student groups to monitor academic achievement through regular formative assessments and individual intervention plans.
- ☞ **Student Achievement Conferences K-12** – articulated support to schools through careful analysis of student results and accountability plans for all schools (PI and Non-Title 1).
- ☞ **English Learner and Special Education** – program and services monitored for support to students.

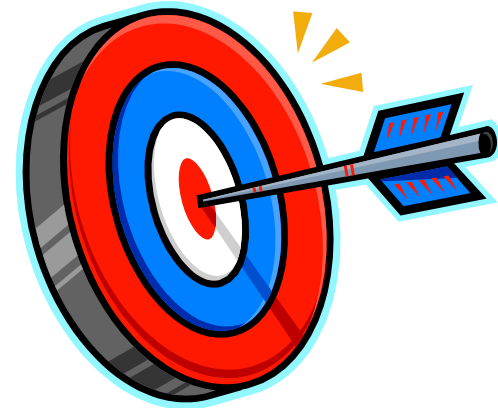
